Pond Management

Learn how to manage water quality and restock fish in your home pond. Understanding seasonal pond cycles and methods to decrease nutrient runoff can assist homeowners improve visual appeal and reduce long term costs. Proper pond management can also reduce noxious odors, minimize unwanted vegetation, and reduce sedimentation.

Testing Lawn and Garden Soil *Test your own soil*

Learn how to test your personal soil, interpret the results, and develop a management plan for your lawns and gardens. Soil samples will be tested for composition, pH, and essential nutrients. Results will then be used to calculate nutrient amendments.

To collect a soil sample: remove ground cover, dig a 4 inch hole with a hand trowel, take a slice of soil (from the side of the hole, from ground level to the 4 inch depth), and place 1 to 2 cups of soil in a container.

CONSERVING FUEL, TIME, AND SOIL

ometimes less is more- this holds true throughout our lives and especially when it comes to conventional farming practices. According to NRCS studies, farmers practicing continuous conventional till use just over six gallons of diesel fuel per acre each year. Continuous no-till requires less than two gallons per acre. Across the country, that difference leads to nearly 282 million gallons of diesel fuel saved annually by farmers who practice continuous no-till instead of continuous conventional till. These savings add up for individual farmers. Let's assume an average off-road diesel fuel price of \$2.05 per gallon. If a producer farming 500 acres of crops switches from continuous conventional till to continuous no-till, they will save 2,080 gallons of diesel fuel, more than \$4,250 worth each year. Fewer passes in the field means less labor and equipment expenses that can add up to several thousand dollars saved each year. These instant savings can off-set some of the costs for no –till equipment.

Furthermore, It's no secret that no-till practices have shown to increase soil biological activity and soil organic matter as well as reduce soil erosion. These influences may take longer to see an economic benefit but can put you on the path to additional economic gains over time. Each customer needs to bring containers with plastic liners & 1/3 full of pond water. This is for each pond. If you are stocking more than one pond, containers for each pond are required so fish can be separated.

A maximum of 100 fish, or 1000 minnows may be placed in each container.

Pick up location will be near the USDA Service Center, 2650 Richville Dr. SE, Massillon, Ohio. The USDA Service Center is located approximately 1/4 mile north of US Route 30 on Richville Drive across from University Village and next to Anchor Baptist Church. The Fender's truck will be parked on Business Place, which is the road between the USDA Service Center and Anchor Baptist Church. You may pull up along side the fish truck to pick up your order; however keep as far to the right as possible so that you do not block the road to through traffic.
